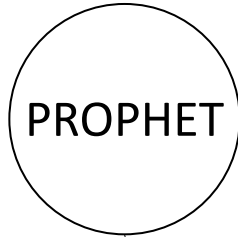

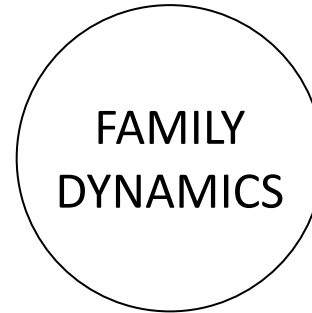

GOD'S CREATION

Tension 1- Your value, worth, hope and righteousness can only come from your foundational identity. Your distinct rhythms come from your functional identities.


Tension 2- Your missionary identity is not your only functional identity. Your distinct rhythms reflect all of them and they can tug on each other.

Tension 3- Your missionary identity is not the only functional identity God uses in the kingdom. Learning to overlap and partner with other functional identities without losing your distinctiveness prevents frustration and mission drift.
